Charles O. Monroe, 89, of North Augusta, SC and formerly of Morganton, passed away Monday, December 13, 2010 in Augusta, GA. Born January 15, 1920 in Eagle Springs, NC, he was a son of the late Carl Alexander Monroe, Sr. and Minnie Sewell Monroe.
