Earl Elkins, 92, of Morganton, NC passed away June 29, 2015. He was born to the late Albert and Louise Elkins on July 28, 1922 in Pike County, KY.

Earl was born in the coalfields of Southeastern KY, where he was deafened by a bout with meningitis at the age of 14. He graduated from the KY School of the Deaf, and went on to receive his BA degree from Gallaudet College, in Washington, DC. Later, he earned his MA degree in Educational Administration from California State University at Northridge. His professional life was focused on service to the Deaf and hard of hearing communities, first as a teacher at schools for the Deaf in MS, KY, and TN for 20 years. He moved his family to NC in 1966 to work as a Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing in Eastern NC, then later in Morganton from 1970-80. His last position, before retiring, was as the Director of the Deaf inpatient mental health program at the Central State Hospital in Indianapolis, IN. He returned to NC in 2000 to reside in Burke County on the family "homestead" in the Dry Ponds Community.

Earl was a man of many interests which included the outdoor activities of gardening, hiking, camping, and fishing. He was also skilled in basic auto mechanic work, and wood working. No stick of wood laid around long, before he was making something of it, be it shelves, furniture, or birdhouses. His true passion was in Scouting. He
