John William Cole, 83, of Grace Ridge Retirement Community in Morganton, NC died Wednesday, February 10, 2016. Born in Walsall, Staffordshire, England on June 29, 1932, he was the son of the late James William Cole and Nellie Elizabeth Franklin Cole.
