Max was reunited with his beloved family when he passed from this life into his heavenly home. His passing was peaceful and gentle – with his nephew, James, by his side, befitting the way he lived his life on earth. Max, a well-known Christian, was a man of God and of the Scriptures and was a member of Burkemont Baptist Church. He was known to be a sort of encyclopedia of the Bible. He had been a leader of the Awana program for many years at the church. He had attained the highest awards possible as a leader and through the program. Max dearly loved teaching children, teaching the 5-6th grades in Awana, and the 2nd grade in Vacation Bible School. Max is also recognized for his 66 years of dedication to his church, making him one of the longest serving active members. Having served his country faithfully, Max retired from the U.S. Army.
