Wade married his wife Lori in 2011. His patience and quiet strong nature shined through as an asset with his stepsons, Brady Mull and Braxton Mull. Wade's family bliss was complete when his son Albert Wade Ogle III "Tad" was born in 2013. Tad brought a shining light and softness into his world. Teaching the boys to be

honorable and conduct themselves in a dutiful manner was paramount to Wade.

As a young family man, Wade and his brother Sam took a leap in starting Sure Point Builders Construction Company in 2012. Wade was hard working and the entrepreneurial spirit continued into development and design. Sure Point created the community of Tudor Croft in Black Mountain, NC.
