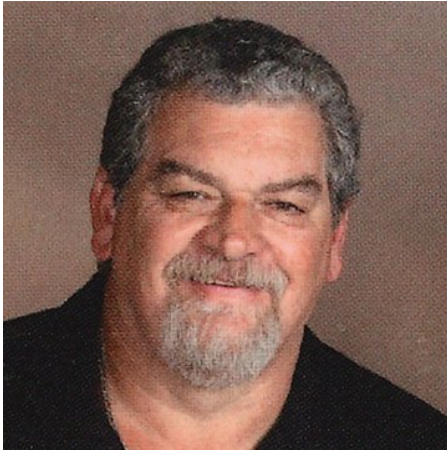




*Brian Keith Yount*

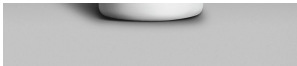
