Dean worked for Frederick Edwards before health challenges eventually led him to disability. Even then, his joy, humor, and love for others never faded.

Dean loved the outdoors, especially fishing and hunting. He looked forward to family hunting trips to Wilkes. As well as trout fishing trips to Cherokee, bass fishing on the lake, and surf fishing at the beach. He found happiness in simple pleasures like shooting basketball, playing cornhole and ladder ball in the summer, sledding in the winter, and pulling off a good practical joke. He loved good food (especially steak, home cooking, and homemade blueberry cobbler). and his favorite teams (NC State

One of his greatest joys was spending time with family. He took special pride in teaching his great-nieces, Cherish and Lakelynn, sign language, patiently sharing a world that meant so much to him. He deeply loved and missed his loyal dog, Bud.

Most importantly, Dean loved Jesus. He attended Grace Baptist Church when able and remained a member of Maple Grove Baptist Church in Hays, North Carolina, where he will be laid to rest.

Dean's life was filled with faith, laughter, and love. While he lived without sound on earth, today he hears clearly, speaks freely, and rejoices fully in Heaven.


