He loved his Ford pickup, "Ol Blue." He looked forward to the yearly fishing trips at Santee Cooper with the other drivers. He was the best storyteller around and gave better driving directions than a map. He was a member of Brookwood Baptist church. Jim served honorably in the United States Army in Berlin, Germany.

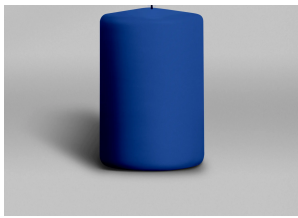
