Josephine "Jo" McNeilly Pitts, 86, of Glen Alpine died on Sunday, March 10, 2019 after a period of declining health. Born in Morganton on July 28, 1932, she was the middle of three children of the late Roy and Jessie Hipps McNeilly. Her mother died when she was eleven. Two years later she welcomed into her life a loving, inspiring step-mother, Blanche Horton, and her sons, Alton and Clifton.
