She is survived by her devoted daughters, Debra Martin (Robert) and Pamela Story (David), her sisters Joan Nielsen and Janet Hilton, and her brother John Fyelling. Joyce was a proud grandmother to four grandchildren: Noelle Martin, Jacob Martin (Summer), Gabrielle Miller (Trever), and Spencer Story. She was also the loving great-grandmother of six: Landon Martin (Marissa), Gaven Sweeney, Grayson Burleson, Aden Burleson, Lynkin Miller, and Kennedy Martin. These children brought joy to her life.
