Kenneth Carswell Jr. passed away on Tuesday, December 23, 2025 at the age of 56. He was born on December 26, 1968, to the late Dowl Kenneth Carswell Sr. and Edna Brewer Carswell in Morganton, NC. Kenneth attended Mull's Grove Baptist Church during his youth and was an active member of Faith Free Will Baptist Church upon his passing.
