Maj. Charles E. "Box" Hallyburton, Sr., (U.S. Army retired), 74, of Morganton died Wednesday, September 25, 2013. He was born in Burke County on September 21, 1939 and was a son of the late Jay Vance Hallyburton and Pearl Sides Hallyburton. He was a U. S. Army veteran of the Korean conflict and retired with a rank of Major from the U.S. Armed Forces in 1999. Major Hallyburton was a proud member of the 82nd Airborne Division, of Ft.
