Mary Elizabeth "Betty" Tester Severt, 86, of Morganton, NC, entered eternal rest with her Lord on December 30, 2022.

Ms. Severt was born February 26, 1936, in Valle Crucis, N.C. to the late Thomas Duke Tester and Margaret Jeanette Tester. She was the youngest of 12 siblings and raised in Valle Crucis, N.C. or "God's Country" as she affectionately called it.

Ms. Severt graduated from Lees-McRae College in Banner Elk, N.C. in 1956. After her three children reached school age, she became a teaching assistant at Wilkesboro Elementary School in Wilkesboro, N.C.
