Mr. William Tellis "Tell" Burns, Sr., 86, joined his beloved wife, Erma, to be with our Lord Jesus Christ on Friday, April 27, 2007. He was born March 13, 1921 in Burke County, NC, and was a son of the late James Russell and Katie Icard Burns. In addition to his parents and wife, Erma Walker Burns, he was preceded in death by brothers, James Robert Wilford Burns, Everet Harly Burns, John Ellis Burns, and Finley Monroe Burns; and sisters, Ollie May Burns, Carrie Lee Burns Baird, Beulah Estelle Burns Moore, and Virginia Mearl Burns Hunneman.
