Norman Frank "Norm" Noe, 86, of Morganton passed away Monday, January 1, 2018 following a courageous struggle with Alzheimer's disease. Norm was known as a gentleman even in the last season of his life.

Norm was born in Columbus, Ohio on August 6, 1931, to the late Frank H. Noe and Cleo Osborne Noe. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by son Norman Frank Noe, Jr. and brother Melvin Noe.

After moving to Morganton, he taught band at Freedom High School and Salem Junior High. Norm was well known for his quality high school band programs.

'Mr. Noe' was well loved and respected by his students, their parents and other faculty members. His leadership and instruction guided students in the band program and instilled a life-long love of music.

Norm also served as assistant principal at several schools in Burke County.

He was a veteran of the Ohio National Guard, past president of the Optimist Club and an active member of First Union Methodist Church, where he served as interim choir director.
