Peggy Bright Poole, 91, died peacefully on Saturday, February 3, 2024 surrounded by her family. Peggy was born in Morganton on May 20, 1932, the only child of Clyde Vernon Bright and Clydia Hawkins Bright. A graduate of the Morganton High School Class of 1950, Peggy married the love of her life, Louis, and supported his Navy service through World War II and Korea. After his service was over, they settled in Morganton and welcomed a daughter, Loretta. Peggy and Louis enjoyed spending free time on the lake, Sunday afternoon drives with close friends and their sports car club, and in later years, warm days in Sunset Beach, NC. She worked at Great Lakes Carbon for 44 years, officially retiring as Payroll Supervisor in 2000. She was a member of First Advent Christian Church for over 40 years where she instilled in her granddaughters the importance of faith and shared her joy of singing and talents in the kitchen with the entire church family and local community. Her chicken pot pies and chocolate Easter eggs were a local favorite for decades. Peggy was also a lifetime member of the Order of Eastern Star, Mimosa Chapter #269 serving as Worthy Matron and volunteering countless hours organizing and fundraising for charities and local causes. Peggy learned to cook at a young age and spent her life serving the best meals and delicious desserts in Burke County to those she loved. Many have been welcomed and enjoyed such a meal around the counter at Peggy's kitchen. She had a talent for sewing and could make the finest dresses, crochet the warmest blankets, and needlepoint the most beautiful designs. Peggy was fondly

referred to by many as “Granny” but was most adored by her 2 granddaughters, Kay and Stacy, and her 5 great-grandsons. She will be remembered for her selfless and unconditional love, her annual Christmas parties, her love of the UNC Tar Heels, and for being the glue that held her family together.

Peggy is survived by her daughter, Loretta Poole Moses of Morganton; her grandchildren, Kay Moses Dillon (Keith) of Ashburn, VA, and Stacy Moses Reel (Matt) of Boiling Springs, SC; great-grandsons, Sean, Emerson, Bryce, Scott, and Jack.

In addition to her parents, Peggy was preceded in death, and welcomed with open arms in Heaven, by her husband of 65 years, Louis Edward Poole.

Funeral services will be held at Noon, Saturday, February 10, 2024, in the sanctuary at First Advent Christian Church with the Rev. Pat Bradshaw officiating. Burial will follow at Burke Memorial Park. The family will receive friends Saturday from 11:00am until Noon before the service.
