Rev. Earl Albert Cook, Jr., 85, of Morganton, NC, passed away Friday, August 11, 2023.

Rev. Cook attended Bethel Methodist Church on Bethel Road. He was a graduate of Duke Divinity School. After his retirement of 37 years, he served as Interim Pastor Emeritus. Rev.
