Tommy Taylor, 76, of Morganton, NC, passed away Wednesday, May 6, 2026.

Born in Burke County, NC on March 2, 1950, he was the son of the late Joseph Robert Taylor and Margaret Taylor Propst.

Tommy was a member of Zion Baptist Church for over 40 years and had served as a greeter and an usher. Mr. Taylor also served for over 30 years in law enforcement, having worked at the Morganton Department of Public Safety, NC Division of Motor Vehicles, and the Department of Corrections.
